
Для формирования у учащихся читательской грамотности следует использовать **разные виды учебных текстов**:

- составные тексты (несколько текстов)




Мы предлагаем примеры несплошных текстов, с которыми учащиеся встречаются или могут встретиться в реальной жизни. К текстам




